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SIGNAL CORPS

To fold pyramidal tent, throw to rear, leaving rear corner wall pins in place. Pull canvas of rear walls sides smooth by corner guys & square iron. Carry right front corner & lay on left rear corner smooth canvas, throw guys in, pull bottom edges even. Return right front corner to cover right rear corner.

Repeat with left front corner, leaving front & back smooth & right & left sides folded inward.

Place hood in square iron which has been folded toward bottom of tent, & continue to fold toward bottom, using iron as core. Keep folds compact & canvas smooth.

Lay all guys in except the 2 on center width, which should be kept out for tying.

Begin at ~~end~~ of roll & fold toward middle and tie with guys. Should make package 11 X 23 X 34.

3 folds each side of hood.

## Mounted Blanket Roll.

Spread shelter half, button side down, fold triangle onto rectangle, turn under 8" of roll strap side. Lay blanket fold 1 across the long edges, with the fold within 1 in. of the folded edge of shelter half turn over 11" of shelter half sides, place pole & pins at either end of side of both roll straps. roll tightly, toward roll strap side, binding roll with turned-under part and 2 roll straps.

To use #6 dry cell with service buzzer, connect positive of cell to lug C of coil (left of coil)

and negative of cell to horizontal bar along side of coil. If to use phone connect to lug T.





Wednesday, July 31<sup>st</sup>. up 5: said goodbyes to Marion which were hard. cried quite a bit - to camp in stage-finished packing - wrote to Hugh. Heart hurt a lot dinner at 11. entrained at 11:30. left at 2 - 14 cars - fast time to Sonora-Noradiv - Rode caboose top over Cajon pass. night write in camp Marion was going to start home at 3. God, please bring me back to her.

Thursday Aug. 1<sup>st</sup> up 7:30. fruit breakfast hot-sleepy + homesick all day. wrote to mother. rode engine in D.M. + in evening. pleasant trip except for my own feelings Marion, my dear, I want to be with you.

Friday Aug. 2<sup>nd</sup>. walked at 4:30 for swim in lake by light of headlight + foges. Salt Lake City at 6:30. Ogden at 7:45; telegraphed Dad - rode engine from Ogden to Echo - slow train. At Green River went swimming again - wrote in car. bed 10:

Saturday Aug 3<sup>rd</sup> up 6: arrived at Cheyenne 6:30 found a lot & had a nice talk. Itz let me have \$50. left Chey at 7:15 office of the day - stopped at North Platte for an hour for exercise. work to Marion. at Grand Island were delayed an hour by engine breakdown. fairly revised to the future. dirty travelling.

Sunday, Aug 4<sup>th</sup> up 8:30 after a good night's rest - noisy wait at Omaha - dirty travelling read + wrote letters most of day. Had a long wait at town named Marion, while the train got water. fast train to Chicago - watched sunset there smoke. In Chicago Major couldn't decide what to do + got the entire battalion soon because they were kept up until 10:30 for a disappointment test. Red Cross workers in the N.Y.C. coach yard gave away cigarettes + sandwiches. Meas can be 2 portion desired.

Monday, Aug 5<sup>th</sup>. up 8:30 on Lake  
shore, noisy welcome at Cleveland,  
got train in Lake Erie. Green com  
officer by Red Cross - very pleasant.  
rode again to Buffalo - fast train.  
tried to call up talkers - but too  
out wrote - bed 10:45.

Tuesday, Aug 6<sup>th</sup>. up at 6: while going  
down the West shore of the Hudson - noticed the  
Poughkeepsie bridge, Storm King, West Point, Stony  
Point, etc. Arr. Weehawken at 9:30. put in charge  
of baggage cars. went with them on carfloat  
around lower New York. Very pleasant  
two hours ride. Then came a long wait in Long  
Island City. Finally left for Camp Mills at  
6:30 on the L.I. R.R. hor day. Hor time  
unloading the baggage after 9 - to the  
S.C. camp on a truck. found tent fixed up  
took a bath + tried 11:45.

Wednesday, Aug 7<sup>th</sup> up 6:30. lots cleaned  
new equipment. took away a lot of their  
good things. fatigue detail in P.M. cleaning  
up canvas left by 160<sup>th</sup> & 187<sup>th</sup> Inf. Very

Oppressive heat. in evg. walked with Davis & Tolman to Rock - p sprats. bed 10:  
Thursday Aug 8. up 6: hot day after windy night with a few sprinkles. inspection of men's equipment. Payday for men. Definite leaving date set. We go via Montreal. wrote to Marion. fed after bath. letters from Home & Hugh.  
Friday Aug 9<sup>t</sup> up 6: handled turning-in of blankets, shackles, fatigues, etc to the reclamation bureau. Hots turned in 8 stores for battalions - to N.Y. in late R.M. to Yorkers & Aunt Meli - pleasant evening talking, with some sad references to Uncle John & some happy ones to Marion - to camp at 1:30. bed 2:00  
Saturday Aug 10<sup>t</sup> up 7:00. checked in khaki clothing & cotton stuff for reclamation cool cloudy day. men nearly all equipped. letter from Dad. in P.M. Capt Orr & looked over equipment of men. to New York on 4:30 train from Country Life Press Station - to Yorkers to see Aunt Meli & for evening. very pleasant supper & talk. Hard to say Good

Bye. She may leave & travel

evening. bath & bed - 10:30

Wednesday, Aug 14<sup>th</sup> up 8:30. fair  
breakfast - still in river at anchor when  
we're waiting for other ships. On at 10 - cards  
part of day. lonely and longing for  
Marion. wrote in evening.

Thursday, Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> up at 8:30 - after a dream of  
Marion and travel. She was with me whispering  
in my ear, and I saw her so plainly. Oh, dear me,  
may it be a prophecy of the future. Still in St.  
Lawrence with the Victoria - all quiet going.  
read in P.M. offices of the Guard - easy  
shift. read at Gros Vaudre. bed 12:00.

wrote to Marion - Mother's wedding day

Friday, Aug 16<sup>th</sup> up 8: easy day. read  
Gros Vaudre. wrote - reached Sydney  
Nova Scotia & anchored in the harbor.  
mail went ashore. tried - far  
feel better from reading. will

evening - cold day.

Saturday, Aug 17<sup>th</sup> In harbor at Sydney, Cape Breton, all day. wrote, & played cards some - wrote to Hugh, Mother - Marion cold day. bed 12 M.

Sunday, Aug 18<sup>th</sup> up 8:45: in port side of Dr. offices went ashore. wrote to Marion. Read. Dear God, give me life for My Marion. watched ships. cool day. read my prayerbook more than usual. Want to be with Marion -

Monday, Aug 19<sup>th</sup>, up 8:45. to shore at 9:45: North Sydney first and then across bay to Sydney pleasant ride on launch. towns are only raw mill towns - coal & iron. shopped & lunched in Sydney. back to Bhamo at 4:30 by ferry and motorboat. Wrote in evening. Interesting day but I want something else - My wife.

Tuesday, Aug 20<sup>th</sup> warm day. loafed around. wrote letters. watched men in swimming from the ship. some officers went rowing & sailing. lonely group of

sick men taken off for hospital.

Wednesday, August 21<sup>st</sup> up 8:15. sailed at 10: with two other ships and a cruiser very pretty day. pleasant travelling. read & worked on Co. fund books. cards in ex. some of the office seacrits. bed 11:45. How I want Maria -

Thursday, Aug. 22<sup>nd</sup> beautiful day quiet seas & steady ship. read most of morning. wrote to Maria in P.M. sewed a little. read in ex. Moon beautiful just over the bows of the ship. Oh the times I've looked at that moon & turned to Maria. Be kind to her, God.

Friday, Aug. 23<sup>rd</sup> up 8:15 after dream of Westminster, Denver & buying tickets to California. murky day. fog in P.M. & eve. read some cards for rest. Office of Day -

Saturday Aug 24<sup>th</sup> foggy in Am. had bath (salt tab). cards (solitaire) in Am. in P.M. wrote to Maria: lonely but resigned. Running in ex. bed at 1:30.

Sunday, Aug 25<sup>th</sup>, rain squalls all day. read in Am. slept in P.M. wrote to Father, Mother, Main & Hugh. rather homesick, rougher - Marion, Marion, come to me tonight, for I want you every way.

Monday, Aug 26<sup>th</sup> read General Orders to Co. read in Am. began Carlyle's History of the French Revolution in the cards in eve. cloudy all day.

Tuesday, Aug 27<sup>th</sup> read 8 cards more of day. a little homesick. have a cold Wednesday, Aug 28<sup>th</sup> practised alarm at 5 in the morning. Slept most of morning. Odd worse rougher. tried to write to Marion. in danger zone read in P.M. + eve. bed 10 -

Thursday, Aug 29<sup>th</sup> cloudy day. picked up escort of U.S. destroyers at daybreak. feel grippsy. sick man on board thought to have meningitis. played quiet a lot. read. wrote to Marion. Rather lonely but feel pretty sick - How I want Marion.

Friday, August 30<sup>th</sup> up 8:30 after bad  
night. read & censored mail most of day,  
lunch - extra good. souvenir news  
in we wrote Mary & Marion. Soft in  
Bristol channel - 2 ships only  
others went Liverpool way - bed 11:45.

Saturday, Aug 31<sup>st</sup> up 8: in Avonmouth  
dock, packed - debarked at 11. entrained  
at 12 for Southampton. Pleasant run  
then South to foot. detrained at 4.  
marched to Rest camp I was in last  
January for night. saw Capt. Godsell  
on pier leaving for France. cold bad  
& had headache all day. good supper-  
bed furnished. Office of clay in evg.  
wrote while other officers went to town -  
Will be back here seven months from  
today again? Marion, Marion, you  
are so fair, so fair, so desired.

Sunday, September 1<sup>st</sup>, up 7:  
breakfast and guard check. W. rock out until  
10:45 AM. In PM. marched to dock &  
waited for transport to load, embarked

at 5: o'clock - down Solent at 7:  
after supper - pretty country. fast  
ships, like the one we crossed on in  
January, a little colder. slept  
in steerage - fairly rough -  
Monday, Sept. 2<sup>d</sup> up at 4:40 in  
cherbourg harbor. breakfast at  
7: debarked at 7:30. marched  
to rest camp on hill outside  
town. hard like as men. guard  
duty rest of day - found a field  
clerk who crossed in January with  
us. Guard duty in P.M. - received  
mail. bed 9:30.

Tuesday, Sept. 3<sup>d</sup>: up 7: late. breakfast  
good. To formating for reassigning men  
to tents. received mail. breakfast  
10:30. marched to dock & extracted  
men in box cars. Officers in 1<sup>st</sup> class  
carriage. left at 1:30 or 2. slow train  
to Meudon where we had supper  
& consideration. Ross, Koch & I had  
compartment to ourselves & made up beds for  
night.

Wednesday, Sept 4<sup>th</sup>. up at 8: after a  
chilly night. cold better but have headache  
all day. wrote to Marion. breakfast at the  
Mars, dinner at Tours. slow time.  
Saw number of U.S.A. Railroad equip't.  
left on seat-

Thursday, Sept 5<sup>th</sup> up at Bourges. some  
coffee. rain - reached La Guerche at 10 -  
detained - searched to a meadow -  
men cleaned up - later I hiked 2 sections  
of C company to Germigny for billets -  
rain. crowded billets. light meals  
all day. headache - fine billet  
for myself. bed 10:15.

Friday, Sept 6<sup>th</sup> up 7:15: improved the  
billets of the men getting more room. gave  
them most of day for clean up and rest.  
in T.M. MATH came for men with ration,  
a doctor & bed cards. installed kitchen  
had hot bean for men for supper. I had  
one letter from Marion in censored  
mail and wrote to Marion. I love her more  
than all else. bed 11: Dated at French  
hotel

Saturday, Sept 7<sup>th</sup> inspection in A.M.  
short lecture on honesty, clean billets etc.  
mail most of day. wrote to Marion, Mother  
Ruth + Eunice took supper at the  
hotel - will eat with company after this.  
Lonely in eve. homesick for Marion -  
Sunday, Sept 8<sup>th</sup> up 7:30 after dream  
of New York harbor + Marion + Hugh. wrote  
and censored all day. in eve worked out  
schedule for the week. good meal - rain -  
rather homesick all day long. My  
Marion, I love you.

Monday, Sept 9<sup>th</sup> up 7: drilled on a schedule.  
rain most of day. dark and dreary. Dr  
P.M. sergeants gave lectures. I got a letter  
from Marion. censored mail and wrote  
in eve. blue and lonely. bed 10: - home-  
sick for Marion -

Tuesday, Sept. 10<sup>th</sup> Capt. Orr out to  
see me - rain most of day. lectures in P.M.  
wrote in eve to Father and Marion. lonely  
as possible, it seems to me - bed early.

Wednesday, Sept. 11<sup>th</sup> rain all day. Capt. off out for dinner. Then Com. and sections in progress. censoring and writing in esp. damp - fewer men sick.

Thursday, Sept 12<sup>th</sup> rain all day. light work. wrote. censored mail. things a trifle smoother. bed 9:30.

Friday. Sept. 13<sup>th</sup> fair day allday. sent sections for berries & wood in Am. books in P.M. wrote. read Q.E.F. General orders. censored - bed 10:11;

Saturday, Sept 14<sup>th</sup> inspection in Am. semi full pack. wrote and read the rest of the day. lovely. beautiful day. bright, sunny and fine. to bed 9:30

Sunday, Sept 15<sup>th</sup> up 7:30. now in mess line but took all morning to straighten out. wrote, read - wonderfully good news from the front. St. Mihiel + the Armes. letter from mother in the afternoon an aviator fell near here is sadly his nose. censored and wrote in esp - to bed 10:30. another aviator hit church burned.

Monday, Sept. 16<sup>th</sup> drill in Am. read G. W. in P.M. Captain Orr out, going about and letters from home and Marion. Maj. Chalmers wrote rated my billet so I moved. wrote in evg. lot. Marion dear, I love you - Sgt. Hydrick went to replace Sgt. Haiford - Sonet trade.

Tuesday, Sept 17<sup>th</sup> Drill in Am. salty. Payday for men - issued gas masks + helmets in P.M. gas drill, lonesome, wrote letters in eve. thunder shower in eve. bed 9:45; Captain Orr is C.O. of the Bn. Wednesday, Captain Orr out, he had dinner at the hotel with him. very pleasant meal.

Wednesday Sept. 18<sup>th</sup> Wyman had 200 pos stolen from his pocket during the night. Spent the morning trying to locate it. gas mask and road drill in P.M. censored and wrote in evening. rain in eve. letter from Marion - bed 10:45.

Thursday, Sept. 19<sup>th</sup> rain. snow last night that covered sqts. third man questioned - in Am. satisfied to his innocence. censored mail in eve. wrote to Marion. bed 10:

Today, Sept. 20<sup>th</sup> up 7: rainy. easy day.  
packing up kitchen & extra bedding had meal at  
10:30. gave away the coffee we had boiled & not used.  
on route 3. very easy lake. stopped at clock  
watched 2 boats though. la Guadeloupe at  
3: formed car sections at square. A  
train at 6, entered after meal, at 7.  
left at 12:10. Office of the day  
as usual.

Saturday, Sept 21<sup>st</sup> slept on floor  
of compartment. up at 6:30. chilly.  
breakfast late, uncomfortable. at  
Dijon we had bread & meat & we  
had omelette. 6:30 & pleasant ride then  
afternoon. saw Mont P. (Blanc?) like a big  
thunderhead on the southeastern horizon  
reached Dijon at 6:30. made coffee  
and lay in yards all night though  
we planned to leave at 10. slept on  
floor again. saw Red cross train (W. 61)  
Sunday, Sept 22<sup>nd</sup>. woke at 7:30  
just a little way from Dijon. very  
pretty hill country and fine

engineering. saw a cross + chapel  
on the top of one wooded point shaped hill -  
also a ruined castle, still looking  
it over the village below. stopped at  
Mits souvenirs for bats + coffee. Left  
main line of P. L. M. + branched off for  
Chatillon/sur Seine. rain. somewhat  
lonely + homesick for Marion - rain  
at Chatillon/sur Seine. billeted at Boulay.  
I marched battalions there. saw Lt. Bourb.  
Set settled for night about 9. to bed after  
a sponge bath - as tired as possible.

Monday, Sept. 23<sup>rd</sup> up 7:30. easy day  
getting straightened out. to Chatillon  
after dinner. saw Lt. de Baum and  
Maj. Chase. The major is sore because we  
weren't used (Whetzel) as instructors at  
Camp Kearny. cashed my check. back to  
Boulay in truck. wrote to Marion.

Tuesday, Sept 24<sup>th</sup> up 7:30. easy day. money.  
Signed payroll. lonely, cold: cards in en route.  
Whetzel + Koch. wrote to Marion. Please,  
I am with you tonight.

Wednesday, Sept. 25<sup>th</sup> up 7:30. breakfast 8.  
censored mail. talked to Non-commissioned to  
Chabillon, / skins in P.M. shopped. back to Bumey  
at 4. supper with company C. Seated in eve.  
wrote to Mary. bed 9:45. Hot bath -  
Thursday, Sept 26<sup>th</sup> worked on letters  
and promotions all morning. visited at  
Chateau in P.M. music and refreshments.  
wine + cake. wrote in eve. talked French.  
Conrad caught stealing + man handled by men -  
bed 10:30. I want Marion.

Friday, Sept 27<sup>th</sup>. up 6:25. headed to  
Chabillon for gaspar 7. an hour's trip.  
tested all masks with lacrymatory gas.  
back to Bumey at 10:00. censored mail.  
Mail came for men - I was disappointed  
and felt it. Wrote in eve. bed early.

Saturday, Sept 28<sup>th</sup> up 8. inspection  
in A.M. talked to men. read in T.M.  
news of riots in Champs Elysees + Algiers.  
In eve. cards with Koch + others.  
4 letters from States, latest 15<sup>th</sup> Aug.  
bed 10:30.

Sunday, Sept. 29<sup>th</sup> up late. 8; censored  
mail in P.M. went with Capt. C. M. Lt Davis, Lohman  
to Col. Gerst's for music. pleasant afternoon  
with enough tactical stuff to be very  
interesting. wrote. in eve went to Lohman  
with officers for dinner. fine meal. potato soup  
warm with corned beef, chicken with mushrooms,  
flet of beef. salad, cheese, chocolate pudding  
- cake - assorted wines. Pleasant talking  
after the meal. left at 11:30. censored  
mail until 2.

Monday, Sept. 30<sup>th</sup> up 7: to go with mail.  
breakfast late. lectured to company on  
Signal corps duties. rain in A.M. sleepy.  
In P.M. sent 16 Noncoms to Signal School.  
wrote in evening - worked up lecture for  
tomorrow. bed 10. Maria; I want  
you to be with me always -

Tuesday, Oct 1<sup>st</sup> up 7: lectured to co in A.M.  
cold. To Chittenden P.M. Signal school. got my pay  
check and cashed it. Company visited  
the chateau of the town. movie in evening.  
bed 10:45. lonely.

Wednesday, Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup> cold. paid men in  
P.M. for letters from M. maps work. in-  
censed. wrote. madmen examination  
questions for M.S.E.T 1<sup>st</sup> El d.y. bed 11:30.  
Thursday, Oct 3<sup>rd</sup> 27 yrs. old. to  
Supt. School headquarters in Am. maps work in  
P.M. wrote & read in evn. bed 11:30. headache.  
Friday, Oct. 4<sup>th</sup> up 8: headache all day, skipped  
breakfast, school in AM. rained in PM. hills  
to trench area north of Chillicothe for demonstration  
of fireworks. very pretty. bed 8: cold. sick.  
Saturday, Oct. 5<sup>th</sup> up 7:30. a little off color.  
tried. inspected company. censored mail.  
changed my billet so as to have a fireplace.  
soaked up heat from fire all PM & evn. wrote  
to Marion & Ruth. bed 9:30.

Sunday, Oct 6<sup>th</sup> up 8. hot sponge  
back in front of fire. loafed most day  
censored mail. Koch promoted. Major coming  
back - blue day, didn't write home  
too loudly & domineering. Please teachers.  
Monday, Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> up 7:30. private  
election walk in Am. Map arrived just

before noon. Bushed to Paris. All  
officers to town except Davis Maj. All MDS  
to town in eve. for lecture by Lt. Boucher on  
means of liaison back 9:15; bed -

Tuesday, Oct 8th barked to Chatillon in  
A.M. for telephone work at wire depart-  
ment of Signal School. 140+ men from the  
battalion back to Buresy for dinner.  
After dinner, wire review with  
splicing, deadending etc. in eve.  
wrote, read. had a hot sponge  
bath & shave. bed late.

Wednesday, Oct 9th Marion's Birthday,  
24. Barked to Chatillon again. in  
afternoon, aerial construction talks  
and discussion, in eve talked  
over promotions with Co. officers. to  
Front soon. wrote to Marion.

Thursday, Oct 10th to Chatillon  
in morning. Switchboard work. in afternoon  
lecture seats for Paris telephones. wrote to  
Marion & May in eve. cold. have griphy  
feeling, perhaps from wine. bed 9:45.

Tuesday Oct. 11th school all day, here in  
Bunney. Hieder back to Br. letter from  
Amric. wrote in my bed 10 -  
Saturday October 12th lectures in  
morning. the last, I hope. to Chatillon in  
P.M. to shop. walked both ways. read +  
censored. Nordstrom + Hieber left to get  
tracks. rain.

Sunday, October 13th. Mother's Birth-  
day up 8. rain. investigated  
a claim for damage to a field. none -  
censored wait. In P.M Gayle Barrot  
came to see Dairin. called. work in 82.  
bed 10: 45.

- Monday, Oct 14th up 7:30. Capt Orr  
+ I had a row with Maj. over reduction of  
Non Coms. left Bunney at 1. with Battie  
Marched Chatillon. entrained about  
4. lack of trucks held upon baggage  
until late. left about 7:30. via  
Champlain slept 2 to a comfort-  
ment. took blanket in my suitcase  
+ was fairly warm.

Tuesday Oct. 15<sup>th</sup> up at Bologne.  
lay there until 12:30. watched  
train of artillery go through.  
left at 12:45: slow train to Rouy-  
Châtelain - where we had supper  
at 4:30-5:30 - rain lay in yards  
until 8:00 slow train to Toul  
Wednesday, (Oct 16<sup>th</sup>) up in yards  
at 7:00 to barracks - then to town  
for dinner - reported at G.S.C. in P.M.  
assigned train for duty. got a gang  
of dinner men at work on subscribing  
to mess. back to barracks for supper.  
+ night wet - rain  
Thursday (Oct 17<sup>th</sup>) to Toul in AM  
with them for drive + boat to St Mihiel  
no time for training - went with  
Col Black to St Mihiel (on river) -

began firing a salute and soon all the whistles in the harbor were blowing to celebrate the signing of the peace treaty. very soon most of the ships dressed with their signal flags and made quite a show. In the harbor were the Geo. Washington the St Louis, Oklahoma, Pretoria, Pres. Grant, and others. The Leviathan was coaling from lighters loaded by a collier. conducted. sundown  $9\frac{3}{4}$ . bed shothy.

To Hotel Pennsylvania - but saw a line so I beat it to the Knickerbocker - got a room & bath, & took a good swim - supper in room bed 11 - wrote a little.
